## LOOE RNLI LIFEBOAT STATION

## Clive Palfrey takes over as Looe RNLI Lifeboat Operations Manager as Dave Haines retires after 32 years of voluntary service to Looe RNLI

On Wednesday 30 October 2024, we surprised Dave Haines with a birthday party at the lifeboat station to celebrate his 70th birthday. This was the perfect opportunity for our crew and friends to thank Dave and acknowledge his amazing 32 years of voluntary service to the RNLI, RNLI Looe Lifeboat Station and the community of Looe as he steps down from the Lifeboat Operations Manager (LOM) role.



One of Dave Haines' final duties before he officially stood down was to hand the LOM pager and keys to the station over to Clive. As our new Lifeboat Operations Manager, Clive has taken over the responsibility for the operational activities of the station, providing leadership for our operational crew, ensuring the charity's inshore lifeboats and launch tractors are in a constant state of readiness to launch on operational service.

Speaking about his new appointment, Clive says :"I

am proud to be part of the crew at Looe, starting as boat crew, I progressed to helm with a responsibility for coordinating crew training, I am now excited to be taking on the Lifeboat Operations Manager role. I am looking forward to building upon Dave's legacy, developing our lifesaving service and supporting our volunteers at the station <u>#SavingLivesAtSea</u>

When the RNLI decided to re-establish an inshore lifeboat station back in 1992, Dave Haines was one of the first members of the community in Looe to volunteer as boat crew. Dave quickly progressed to helm the D Class inshore lifeboat until he reached the age of 45, which, at that time was the age volunteer crew had to step down. Dave stayed on with the station volunteering as a Launch Authority and shore crew. 20 years ago in 2004, shortly after the Albatross boathouse was opened, Dave was asked to take on the station's Lifeboat Operations Manager and has undertaken this role until his retirement last Wednesday, 30 October 2024, his 70th birthday. When Dave entered the crew room to cheers, he was greeted by members of his family, our current crew, former crew members, members of the station fundraising groups who have worked with Dave over the years and the Naismith family.

Tom Mansell, regional lifesaving lead for the RNLI in the South West has had a long association with Looe Lifeboat Station and was disappointed that he could not attend in person, but via a video link Tom joined the celebration to personally thank Dave on behalf of the RNLI for his 32 years of voluntary service to the RNLI and community of Looe. Tom recalls "back in 2004 he was the RNLI divisional inspector for Looe and when the previous Operations Manager left he "twisted" Dave's arm to act as caretaker Operations Manager until someone was appointed and the rest as they say "is history".

Senior helm Clive Palfrey, who will be taking on the Lifeboat Operations Manager role after Dave retires continues the story. "During Dave's 20-year tenure as Lifeboat Operations Manager, he has accepted 3 inshore lifeboats into the care of the station, The D Class Ollie Naismith in 2010, in 2016 the Atlantic 85 Sheila and Dennis Tongue II and the Ollie Naismith II in 2022". Clive goes on to record that "during Dave's 32 years of service the lifeboats in Looe have been launched on service 1027 times, crews have assisted 826 people and saved 65 lives and this "saving lives at sea" legacy is something that Dave can be very proud of".

Shore crew member, Carol, presented Dave with the station's One Moment One Crew photograph signed by our crew, together with an "IOU" from the crew for a weekend away to relax after switching off his pager.

In thanking Clive, Tom, and everyone in the room, Dave recalled the early days, when before they had a quad bike or tractor, they had to push the D Class down the beach to launch and said "it was heavier to push back up the beach afterwards". He remembers with pride receiving the 3 inshore lifeboats, moving the station to Middleton's corner, opening the Albatross boathouse, welcoming his Majesty the King, when he was the Duke of Cornwall, to the station back in 2014 and representing the station at Westminster Abbey for the RNLI 200 service earlier this year. Dave thanks the crew for supporting him over the years and mentions several in the room, Nick, Toby, Dave, Brian, Jeff and John, who also volunteered as the station reopened and still have connections with the station.

Dave's time as Lifeboat Operations Manager must draw to an end due to his age, but he is not severing his ties with the RNLI or Looe Lifeboat Station. He said: "I have accepted the important role to chair the station's Lifeboat Management Group. My new role coordinates the operational and fundraising activities of the station and represents the RNLI in our local community".


To ensure Dave came down to the surprise celebrations he was asked by Tom Mansell to meet him by the station. As Dave waited outside, he said: "I've had time to reflect on my lifeboat career, over the last 32 years, and I am very proud of our achievements and all the crew, boathouse guides, shop and fundraising volunteers I have met and worked with over the years. I look forward to following the exploits of my current and future crew in the years to come under Clive's leadership. The crew room upstairs was very quiet, and I thought the crew were concentrating on their navigation training, even when my daughter Emma came to find me, I had no idea of the complete surprise awaiting me as I walked into the crew room to a sea of familiar faces."

**Shouts:** Our crew at Looe have been ready to answer the pager and rescue those in difficulty. Between 17 September 2024 and 13 November 2024 our volunteer crews responding to 6 shouts.

**Souvenir Shop:** Subject to volunteer availability, and the weather, our souvenir shop is open daily between 11 am and 4 pm until 21 December 2024, then, after a short break over Christmas and the New year our shop will reopen daily. Our shop has a wide range of products, including Christmas cards, gifts and 2025 calendars.

**Albatross Boathouse:** As the 2024 season draws to an end, our boathouse is now closed to the public and Stormy Stan is having a well earned rest for the winter months. Our wonderful team of volunteer boathouse guides hope everyone enjoyed looking at the charity's inshore lifeboats and launch tractors, finding out about the RNLI, the Looe volunteer crew, our shouts and how to keep safe on the water. They have enjoyed meeting new people, answering all of your questions, and are proud to be part of the amazing team of volunteers here at RNLI Looe Lifeboat Station. Our volunteer guides may open the boathouse for a few hours on winter weekends if the weather is good and they all look forward to welcoming you all again from Easter next year when our boathouse reopens daily to the public.

**Keeping safe on the coast:** RNLI lifeguard cover on the Whitsand bay beaches have now finished for this year, so it is more important than ever to Respect the Water, check the tide times, wear appropriate buoyancy aids and take a method of calling for help. If you are on East Looe beach check the orange windsock on East Looe Town Trust's building by the Old Lifeboat Station. If it is pointing out to sea this denotes an offshore wind which can easily blow an inflatable, stand up paddleboard, kayak or canoe out to sea and hinder your attempts to return to shore safely.



### Float to live:

However you end up in the water, if you get into trouble, remember to Float to Live. Cold water shock is our body's natural response to entering cold water and can very quickly lead to drowning. Floating, even for a short time, allows the effects of cold water shock to pass. It enables you to regain control of your breathing and your survival chances will greatly increase.

You can learn how to float following these five simple steps:

- 1. Tilt your head back, submerging your ears.
- 2. Relax and try to control your breathing.
- 3. Move your hands to help you stay afloat.
- 4. Your legs may sink but that's OK everyone floats differently.
- 5. Spread your arms and legs to improve your stability.

We actively encourage practising how to float in a safe environment. It's a lifesaving skill and having the confidence to float in a life or death situation could make all the difference.

If you see someone struggling in the water, fight your instinct to jump in and help. Stay on land and 999 and ask for the Coastguard at the coast, or Fire & Rescue when inland.

Tell the person in danger to float on their back and throw them something that floats, which they can use for buoyancy.

The World's Toughest Row by Atlantic Campaigns brings together teams from all walks of life, united by the same objective - to take on the unique challenge of crossing an ocean in a rowing boat



It's the premier event in ocean rowing and the World's Toughest Row. The challenge will take us more than 3000 Miles west from San Sebastian in La Gomera, Canary Islands, Spain (28oN 18oW) to Nelson's Dockyard, English Harbour, Antigua & Barbuda (17oN 61oW). The annual race begins in early December 2024, with up to 30 teams participating from around the world.

We are now in the final month before race start. The boat has been delivered to the shippers and we are crossing our fingers she arrives in La Gomera safely.

The crew now meets almost weekly to get the final bits of kit in our hand luggage. We are writing our boat rules that we all will agree to. Most are about being kind and considerate. Easy when you're sitting at Nat's kitchen table well fed and rested! We are flying out at the end of this month. On arrival we have our final

inspection and packup of the boat before we can get on the water for one more seatrial. We will be checking all our systems work and that we are good to go.

We are due to leave on 12th December but if the fleet is ready and the weather is good then we could go earlier.

## **NEWS FROM EAST LOOE TOWN TRUST**

As we rapidly head towards the festive season, we are proud to be working alongside Looe Town Council and Looe Harbour Commissioners to provide Christmas lighting for the town. As well as providing the electricity for the street festoons we also provide the lights in the Rose Garden, on the Old Guildhall Museum & Gaol and on the seafront. We have made some additions to the lights this year and hope that as many people as possible enjoy the lantern parade and the official switch on of the lights.

As we head towards the end of 2024, the Old Guildhall Museum & Gaol has closed to the public until next year. We would like to take this opportunity to publicly thank our wonderful team of volunteers for all their hard work and dedication. However, they still continue to work behind the scenes throughout the winter and if you are interested in helping, please contact the museum curator at <u>museum@eastlooetowntrust.co.uk</u>.

Another group of dedicated volunteers that deserve recognition operate from the Guildhall Tea Room – this is accessed through the Rose Garden and is on the ground floor of the Guildhall. Tea, coffee, biscuits and a friendly welcome is guaranteed six mornings a week here – please pop in and say hello.

As ever, our maintenance team continue to look after our historic buildings as well as the Wooldown and the beach and seafront. Our tractor and surf-rake are expensive to buy and operate but are an essential part of keeping our beach in such a lovely condition for all to use. It is often thought that we receive funding from Cornwall Council or Looe Town Council for this and other purposes but we have no powers to raise money in the way that councils can and have to rely on our own resources (and resourcefulness).

As in previous years, we are delighted that so many people visit the beach and we aim to keep it an attractive and safe place to visit. Even if you are a regular visitor, please take notice of the safety and information signs on the seafront and be aware of sea and weather conditions before entering the water.

This year there has been a lot of activity on the seafront with the major restoration works on the Old Lifeboat Station and the Watchtower. This work has been jointly funded by the Trust and a grant from the Shared Prosperity Fund. We are very much looking forward to the project being completed in Spring 2025.

Time for an update on Looe Shedders' quest for a new home, and how recent developments could be a game changer in terms of us becoming a much bigger force for good in the community.

We now have a long-term plan and a short term solution to the lack of our own shed, which has held us back in so many ways - notably in limiting how often we can meet and having to undertake dirty work outside, at the mercy of the weather. As a result, work on our growing list of community projects - see list - is agonisingly slow.

### Long-term plan

We have joined a project aiming to builda "creative hub" at the top of West Looe hill, near the road down to Talland. This would include our shed with a creative hub for local artists, some shared facilities



and an exhibition area. Best case scenario - a planning application is submitted in December and Looe Shedders moves there sometime in 2026.

### Short term solution

We have been offered a container free of charge and the Parochial Church Council has agreed to it being placed alongside two existing storage units in St Martin's Community Hall car park, possibly in January. The container needs a lot of work to make it fit for purpose, but it would enable us to meet more frequently and work on projects regardless of the weather. That in turn might lead to a cycle of more people joining Looe Shedders and us taking on even more community projects.



## WHEELED SPORTS FACILITY FROR LOOE

An application for pre-planning advice was recently submitted to Cornwall Council for the proposed site at the far end of the Millpool Car Park. The aim is to create a dedicated outdoor space for skateboarders with a low level, street style circuit.

The Looe Development Trust (LDT) are leading the project to build this new stateof-the-art facility in partnership with Looe Town Council and The Boundless Trust. Discussions about the creation of the facility, which would cost in the region of £250,000 to create, have been going on for a number of years – and plans have previously been outlined in a series of open days held within the town. In addition, Boundless Trust have led sessions with the skaters themselves so that their ideas are at the heart of the design.

Looe Town Council have been negotiating with site owners Cornwall Council to provide an acceptable lease – and this is moving in the right direction. Once the results of the pre-application have been received from the Planning department the working group (made up of representatives Looe Development Trust, Looe Town Council and the Boundless Trust) will then consider the recommendations with a view to then submitting a full planning application in the not-too-distant future. Full planning consent has to be obtained before grants could then be applied for. There will be a number of information events for the community to view the plans and we hope to offer their support.

People will know this is a project that has been talked about within the town for quite some time. There have been a lot of delicate negotiations and discussions going on behind the scenes, especially around the site itself, but the submission of the pre- planning application demonstrates real progress. We know there is a massive demand for this facility. Not only will it be a skate park, but it will also serve as an outdoor hub for youngsters within the town.

Previous open days within the town have showcased the plans for the facility, which have been designed jointly by Looe Youth, alongside Maverick Industries, who themselves specialise in the creation and building of skate parks all over the country. Maverick Industries have been responsible for designing and creating similar schemes in a few other Cornish towns, including Bodmin, Falmouth, Millbrook, Porthleven, Redruth and St Ives. This is an exciting project and we hope that the town will support LDT in the provision of this much needed and much wanted youth facility.







Poppy Appeal: We launched our 2024/25 Poppy Appeal in the East Looe Guildhall Rose Garden on Saturday 26th October. ### Advancing Green Energy at Coastguard Flats



Now, this will be his legacy - an organisation that brings families together and provides peer support for those facing the same challenges."

A terminal illness can create immense financial strain, including the loss of income, rising costs for medical transportation, and the need for specialised equipment. Gunners Kids CIC is committed to offering all its services free of charge or at a minimal cost, ensuring that financial barriers do not prevent families from accessing the help they need.

The crowdfunding campaign seeks to raise funds for activity days, workshops, and support boxes for families during these challenging times. Donations will directly support these services, helping families build cherished memories and find comfort in a supportive community.
