A Message from Mayor Cllr Stephen Remington

Many thanks, on behalf of us all at the Town Council, to everyone who has contributed to Looe's summer season.

Through my involvement with Looe Business Forum, I know it has been a challenging year in retail and hospitality, not helped by floods, wind and land slips but, as always, the town has shown its resilience and continued its great offering to our visitors and residents.



East Looe Town Trust completed its magnificent refurbishment of the Old Lifeboat Station and the Watch Tower. Carnival week, creative performances and exhibitions, raft and duck races, the Looe Lugger Classics, the new Well Fest, rock pooling - and more - all added to the amazing array of events this season. We were all so sad that the Food & Drink Festival fell victim to the weather. So much work goes into all these events. August saw the reflective celebration of VJ Day's 80th anniversary and as always, the town will mark Remembrance Sunday on 9th November and Armistice Day on the 11th.

As I write, we look forward to Looe Weekender (19-21 September) and to the visiting Kernowfornia (26-28th). Then comes the Looe Festival of Words (1-5 October). The build up to the Christmas season is looking exciting already - watch out for elf-hunt, festive window displays, late night shopping and of course the New Year's Eve fireworks. The Town Council has continued to provide financial support for many organisations and events in Looe while further developing our own regular community events. There are new initiatives in the pipeline too, but let's leave those for later.

Through all this, the town runs pretty smoothly and deals with serious incidents as quickly as possible. Some duties fall to Cornwall Council, and we appreciate the work of its contractors, staff and our two Members. I thank everyone who works day in, day out, cleaning our streets and toilets, clearing our rubbish, running our schools and library, our harbour and fishers, everyone in every kind of business and service, RNLI and all of our emergency services. Ours is a complex town with ageing infrastructure. Things can't work perfectly all the time, and we'll fall out sometimes. Overall, though, can we not be fairly proud of Looe?

Shouts: Our crew at Looe have been ready to answer the pager and rescue those in difficulty. Between 21 July 2025 and 15 September 2025 our volunteer crews responded to 8 shouts.

Souvenir Shop: Subject to volunteer availability, and the weather, our souvenir shop is open daily between 11 am and 4pm. Our shop has a wide range of products, including Christmas cards and 2026 calendars.

Albatross Boathouse: Our boathouse will be open daily to the public until the end of October half term. Subject to volunteer availability, operational requirements and the weather it will be open daily between 11 am and 4pm. Our team of volunteer boathouse guides will be on hand to show you the charity's inshore lifeboats and launch tractors. They can answer all your questions and tell you more about the RNLI, the Looe volunteer crew, our shouts and how to keep safe on the water.

Keeping safe on the coast: As we move into autumn, the times and frequency of our SE Cornwall RNLI lifeguard patrols change. Patrols at Freathy have now finished for 2025, patrols at Seaton, Tregantle and Sharrow will finish on 28 September. whilst Tregonhawke beach will be patrolled daily until 28 September, then only at weekends until 19 October and the final week of October half term when patrols finish for the year on 2 November 2025. There have been several incidents with swimmers getting caught in rip currents. Please take notice of the red and yellow flags and follow the advice of the lifeguards when they are on duty. When there is no lifeguard cover on the beaches, please take extra care. Always Respect the Water, check the tide times, wear appropriate buoyancy aids and take a method of calling for help. If you need help or see someone in difficulties, call 999 and ask for the coastguard.

If you are on East Looe beach, check the orange windsock on East Looe Town Trust's building by the Old Lifeboat Station. If it is pointing out to sea this denotes an offshore wind which can easily blow an inflatable, stand up paddleboard, kayak or canoe out to sea and hinder your attempts to return to shore safely.





Find your float

Do you know how to #FloatToLive? This World Drowning Prevention Day, we want everyone to practise and #FindYourFloat.

In a safe, lifeguarded location:

- Tilt your head back with ears submerged
- Relax and try to breathe normally
- Move your hands and legs to help you stay afloat
- It's ok if your legs sink, we all float differently
- Once you're over the initial shock, call for help or swim to safety





If you were at any of the September festivals in Looe, you'll have noticed the buzz around our Creative Looe T-shirts. They're part of a fundraising campaign for our flagship project: United by the Sea, a festival celebrating Looe's maritime heritage, planned for March 2026.

United by the Sea will bring together stories, history, and creativity in ways that involve the whole community.

In partnership with Looe Community Academy and Looe Primary Academy, we'll be working with pupils to make 300 ceramic fish. Each child will decorate a fish that will be "released" around the town, ready to be discovered on festival day.

Families will be invited to go on a treasure hunt to track down their creations, encountering costumed actors along the way. Expect tales of smugglers' tricks, wartime Looe, heroic lifeboat rescues, and much more.

Our aim is to nurture pride in Looe's cultural identity and strengthen that vital sense of belonging — especially for our young people.

NEWS FROM EAST LOOE TOWN TRUST

New office location: Our offices have now moved into The Watchtower on the seafront. As some of you will know, the building, along with the Old Lifeboat Station, has recently been renovated - partially funded by the Shared Prosperity Fund. Please note that the phone numbers and the email addresses for the Trust remain the same.

A part of the grant requirements was to ensure that the Old Lifeboat Station provided a steady income to assist with ELTT being able to continue to meet its charitable objects. There is also a requirement for monitoring and evaluations to continue over the next seven years — this will include the efficacy of the solar slates to provide electricity for the Watchtower and the workshop.

The first floor of the Guildhall: Many people have asked what the plans for the first floor of the Guildhall are, now that our office is no longer there. This is currently under consideration by our Board of Trustees. There are many ideas, but all have to be costed and be right for the town and the Trust. Critically, the outcome must generate sufficient income to enable us to continue our duties in the maintenance of heritage buildings as well as the beach, seafront and the Wooldown – all of which costs a lot of money (for which we receive no grant income). Conversations are underway between the Trust and other bodies, including heritage and planning experts. However, the Guildhall Chamber is still presently available as a venue for weddings and other special days – have a look at www.ceremoniesbyamanda.com who can guide you through organising a wedding, funeral, naming ceremony and much more.

The Guildhall door is now famous as the door to the police station in the fictional town of Shipton Abbott and filming has continued this year. It has been a delight to work with the crew and actors of Beyond Paradise and then to see our wonderful town on TV.

Enjoying the seafront and beach: As the long summer days turn autumnal, it is likely that the beach and seafront are not as busy, however it is still a lovely place to visit. Stroll along the seafront, call in at the Beach Café or Pier Café for refreshments, sample a cocktail at Penrock Distillery or enjoy those rays of autumnal sunshine in a Looe Beach Hire deckchair.

Looe Rowing Club and Looe Sailing Club still have events on throughout autumn. There are also other key events such as the Looe Festival of Words, the Looe Weekender and Kernowfornia's music festival on the beach.

The "swim zone" buoys will be brought in for the winter but there will still be intrepid sea swimmers in the water. All users of the beach and the water are urged to be aware of the safety signs on the seafront and to be aware of each other and share the space for the good of everyone.

Any event on Trust land needs to be approved by the Board of Trustees.

Who are they and what do they do?

The Board meet once a month to review Trust business and decide on Trust policies and projects. There are currently eight trustees, all volunteers, who also help to take business forward between formal meetings. There are four full time members of staff who carry out the day-to-day work of the Trust as well as specific projects. For more information, please see our website and our annual reports, which also include audited accounts, on the Charity Commission's website. 












Old Guildhall Museum & Gaol, East Looe



I thought the Lugger Regatta was brilliant this year and I took loads of photos for the Museum photo archive.

As I was loading and titling them, I realised that whilst we had some great images from 1911, 1914 and 1922 we had a huge gap until one from 2018 and then nothing......

So, I made a promise to myself on behalf of the town to make 2025 the year we updated and added to the archive.

Our collection of photos starts to drop off quite dramatically from the late 1940s. This is obviously because many people had cameras and photographs became more commonplace and, ultimately, less special from an historical point of view.

I took plenty of the Carnival, the Gig races and gigs over the Lugger Regatta weekend, the Duck Race, the Emergency Services weekend and even Beyond Paradise filming but I need more, please.

If you have some of the Raft Race, the Looe Ten Miler, May Day Celebrations, any local community event or club or organisation could you email them to the Museum?

It is better to have two or three good images that explain themselves.

If you send me a dozen but three are of the backs of people's heads blocking the view, two are of someone's really cute, but very large, dog obscuring everything, an excellent one but the couple centre-right are having a blazing row, two that would be great if not for the thumb covering the side, one that could have been amazing if it was in focus and three where the subject matter is clear and obvious with people looking interested and involved - well, no prizes for guessing which ones will get the delete button and which three will get saved!

I can't promise to save everything that is sent (hopefully sent), there may be duplications, or I may have included an event already but if we could gather together a good selection of images that showcase our wonderful town and community in the year 2024/2025 for future generations that would be something very special.





The collaboration not only supported another community group but also introduced the Shedders to fresh skills, with members learning glazing techniques from a professional potter.

Yet behind these successes lies a pressing challenge. While the craft team is

happily settled at the Hall, the Shedders' main workshop, where the large-scale projects are carried out, is only on loan. Within the next year the owner is expected to reclaim the space, and without a permanent home the group faces a stark problem: where to store its extensive tools, and how to keep up the community projects for which it is now well known.







VJ Day (Victory Over Japan Day): On 15th August we marked VJ Day and the end of World War 2 by arranging a short service at the Looe War Memorial to coincide with the National two-minutes silence held at midday. Our branch members dipped the five memorial flags (Royal Air Force, Royal British Legion, the Union Flag, Royal Navy, Merchant Navy) for the silence and our Chairman, Louis Portman, recited the Exhortation and Kohima Epitaph. A bugler from the St Pinnock Brass Band played the 'Last Post.' We thank all those that attended the ceremony and it was heartwarming to see sightseers stopping to respect the two-minutes silence.

We also flew the Merchant Navy flag at the war memorial on 3rd September to mark Merchant Navy Day, and the RAF flag on 15th September for Battle of Britain Day.

Poppy Appeal: As well as being at the war memorial on VJ Day, our branch members were also present on the day at the Guildhall Rose Garden and collected over £430 for the Poppy Appeal. The appeal helps support the Armed Forces community in lots of diverse ways, including financial advice to veterans and their families. It also helps fund services like the Battle Back Centre - the first port of call for wounded, injured and sick service men and women as they start their road to recovery. Our branch's 2024/25 appeal is ending and has raised nearly £14,000. We are launching our new Poppy Appeal in the Guildhall Rose Garden

Riverside United Church

The Quay, West Looe, PL13 2BU



The first chapel in Looe was founded by Sir Harry Trelawny, a Cornish eccentric, who converted to Congregationalism and built a chapel in West Looe Square in 1777. After he returned to the Church of England he pulled down his chapel, but his flock built another in 1797 on the site of the present Riverside Church. The present building was built by the thriving worshiping community in 1881 and has considerable historic interest.

Easily found from the A38 and then the A387 and just 20 miles from Plymouth. It is one of the earliest united churches in the country, when in 1966 two Methodist chapels in Looe as well as the Congregational Church (now URC) decided to come together as Riverside United Church.

In 1995 Riverside was completely refurbished when the old pews downstairs were removed and replaced by comfortable seating that can be arranged so that better use can be made of the sanctuary area. The pipe organ was also removed and we now have a very fine digital organ that sounds amazing. Riverside has the largest seating capacity of any building at sea level in Looe and excellent acoustics, so Riverside is used for a variety of concerts throughout the year.

The church is more than the building, the people and atmosphere at Riverside is special.





GUNNERS KIDS CIC LAUNCHES DROP-IN SESSIONS TO SUPPORT FAMILIES AFFECTED BY TERMINAL ILLNESS

Gunners Kids CIC, a Cornish non-profit organisation supporting families with children facing the terminal illness of a parent or caregiver, has expanded its services to include regular drop-in sessions in St Austell, Launceston, and St Ives.

These new sessions aim to provide a safe space for families in need of support, as well as offer professionals the opportunity to learn more about the organisation's work. Gunners Kids CIC already runs a variety of services, including activity days and tailored workshops. In June, the group hosted a jewellery workshop for families, and on 20th July, they will welcome families to an activity day at Wheal Martyn.

In addition to events, Gunners Kids CIC provides tailored support boxes to children, designed to help them navigate anticipatory grief and better understand the challenges of having a seriously ill loved one.

The drop-in sessions are part of the organisation's new outreach programme, offering families a chance to talk to trained volunteers in a supportive, confidential setting. As the volunteer team grows, the organisation hopes to expand this service into more areas.

We are currently overwhelmed by the number of families needing support, and we hope our services help them navigate what is such a difficult time in their lives."
