## LOOE LIFEBOAT STATION



Could you be a lifesaver? Are you looking for a New Year challenge? Looe RNLI are recruiting volunteers to join our inshore lifeboat and shore crew. Being a lifeboat crew member is one of the most exciting and fulfilling volunteer roles you could do.

This is a great chance to learn new skills, gain experience and make new friends. No previous nautical knowledge or skills are needed, as all crew must undergo a full RNLI training

programme. As an inclusive organisation, the RNLI provides first class equipment, training, guidance and support. Here in Looe we aim to launch within 10 minutes of the pagers sounding, so you'll need to live and / or work close to the Lifeboat station in Looe.

We particularly need volunteer crew who are available during the day in Looe and you must be over 18 to volunteer. We need shore crew as well as crew for the lifeboats. Shore crew help out on land to get the lifeboats ready to launch and then clean down and make ready for service after a shout or exercise.

The closing date is 28 December 2025.

**Shouts:** Our crew at Looe have been ready to answer the pager and rescue those in difficulty. Between 16 September 2024 and 6 November 2024 our volunteer crews responding to 2 shouts.

**Souvenir Shop:** Subject to volunteer availability, and the weather, our souvenir shop is open daily between 11 am and 4 pm until 20 December 2025, then, after a short break over Christmas and the New year our shop will reopen daily. Our shop has a wide range of products, including Christmas cards, gifts and 2026 calendars.

Albatross Boathouse: As the 2025 season draws to an end, our boathouse is now closed to the public and Stormy Stan is having a well-earned rest for the winter months. Our wonderful team of volunteer boathouse guides hope everyone enjoyed looking at the charity's inshore lifeboats and launch tractors, finding out about the RNLI, the Looe volunteer crew, our shouts and how to keep safe on the water. They have enjoyed meeting new people, answering all of your questions, and are proud to be part of the amazing team of volunteers here at RNLI Looe Lifeboat Station. Our volunteer guides may open the boathouse for a few hours on winter weekends if the weather is good and they all look forward to welcoming you all again from Easter next year when our boathouse reopens daily to the public.

**Keeping safe on the coast:** RNLI lifeguard cover on the Whitsand bay beaches have now finished for this year, so it is more important than ever to Respect the Water, check the tide times, wear appropriate buoyancy aids and take a method of calling for help

If you are on East Looe beach, check the orange windsock on East Looe Town Trust's building by the Old Lifeboat Station. If it is pointing out to sea this denotes an offshore wind which can easily blow an inflatable, stand up paddleboard, kayak or canoe out to sea and hinder your attempts to return to shore safely.

#### Open water / cold water swimming

Open Water Swimming is becoming more popular around our coasts - whether you're swapping the swimming pool for open water or just enjoying a quick dip, please take care. Safety information can be found on the RNLI website

#### Float to live

However you end up in the water, if you get into trouble, remember to Float to Live. Tell the person in danger to float on their back and throw them something that floats, which they can use for buoyancy.

The blue beach tractor that people are so used to seeing has reached the end of its life and so now we have a red tractor that will be out on the beach moving seaweed and towing the surf rake. The kit to maintain the beach is very expensive and ELTT are grateful for financial donations from the Looe Lions and Looe Town Council this year. We are particularly grateful to West Looe Town Trust who have committed donations over the next three years to help with the costs of the tractor.







**Poppy Appeal:** On Saturday 25th October we launched this year's Poppy Appeal in the Guildhall Rose Garden. It was a successful start to to the appeal with over eleven-hundred pounds (£1,100.99) raised on just that day alone. Don't scoff at the 99p, we are grateful when people donate their loose change. The Poppy Appeal is the Royal British Legion's flagship campaign held every year in October and November, but our Looe Branch collect for the appeal throughout the year (A Poppy Isn't Just for November). In the year ending October 2025, we raised £13,901.74 for the Poppy Appeal, which was our highest total ever and £5,353.99 up on the previous year.

Founded in 1921, the Poppy Appeal raises funds for the RBL's vital work supporting serving personnel, veterans and their families throughout their lives with whatever the need, whenever it's needed. Our support for those in need is made possible by the generous donations of the public and the 50,000 Poppy Appeal collectors and volunteers who dedicate their time each year to helping fundraise across the country. A big thank you to anyone who helped with the Poppy Appeal and to the public for their generous donations.



#### Remembrance Sunday & Armistice Day:

We were heavily involved with the Civic Service held at the Looe War Memorial on Remembrance Sunday. Our

standard-bearers were on parade, our members manned the flag staffs and our President, Louis Portman, gave the Kohima Epitaph and the exhortation. 



The recent Looe Harbour Commissioner election resulted in eight of the existing Commissioners being re-elected for a further three years. The two new members, being Ivan Toms and Will Jaycock, both are local fishermen.

The collapse of the quay wall at East Looe is proving difficult to rectify, with co-ordination between the various bodies involved proving to be very time consuming and frustrating! The Harbour team hope to have a resolution in the near future.

The pontoons have been moved up to their winter moorings in the river to avoid damage from the winter gales. As usual, the majority of the tripping boats have been lifted out of the water for winter storage.

All of the works under our Multi Project Fisheries Grant have now been completed. The cost of the project was circa £725,000 and included:

- (i) Works to Harbour refrigeration facilities
- (ii) Replacement of 300 hardwood mooring piles in commercial berthing areas
- (iii) Replacement of 66 quayside access ladders in commercial berthing areas
- (iv) Replacement Forklift Truck + Safety Platform
- (v) Purchase of Mobile Elevating Work Platform ((MEWP)
- (vi) Upgrade of Harbour CCTV system
- (vii) Lower Quay Fishermen's Stores demolition and rebuild (to include purchase of 5 storage containers).

Free parking has been granted for the Saturdays in December on both LHC owned car parks leading up to Christmas. This is from 8am on the Saturday to 8am on the Sunday.

The Commissioners would also like to recognise the hard work by the Harbour staff to erect all the festive decorations that are central to the town being so popular at Christmas.

On behalf of the Commissioners and staff, we would like to wish locals and visitors a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

Each tiny fish goes through the same careful process as the large ones:

moulding, drying, firing, glazing, and refiring. The Shedders don't take any proceeds themselves – they're giving their time and skills for free to support the project and highlight the positive work they do in the community.

Peter Heywood, trustee of Looe Shedders and Director of Creative Looe CIC, said: "These little fish might be small, but they're helping something wonderful happen for Looe."



#### THE EDWINA HANNAFORD SKATEPARK

For the past 4 years I have been leading a joint project on behalf of Looe Development Trust with our partners, Looe Town Council and Boundless Trust. Following the huge show of support on the Planning Portal from Looe residents we have now received planning permission for the Skatepark. Your efforts made the difference, and I want to thank everyone who attended the open sessions and who took the time to post on the Planning Portal.

We know that people in Looe have been waiting a very, very long time for this and that there have been several false starts. But this is the furthest the project has ever got, and we are all working full steam ahead to raise the funds to build it.

We have plans to launch a Crowdfunder and also there will be other ways that everyone in the town can help to make this long held dream a reality. The cost of the project is going to be in the region of £250K a substantial amount to raise. In addition, we are under a time constraint from Cornwall Council who are also keen to see this project happen. So, it's time to get our skates on and make this happen!

There will be lots of opportunities to get involved. We are setting up a user group and will also be asking organisations and businesses in the town what they can offer to help. In addition, with the help of the designers Maverick who continue to be incredible, we will be submitting applications to the larger funds. Plus, we will be publishing other information on how you can donate or help.

Our very first offer of support came from Sheila's School of Dancing. This year's Christmas shows will be raising funds for the Edwina Hannaford Skatepark – young people raising funds for other young people in the town – just amazing. 


